Security R&D next niche

Security advancement in online computer systems and databases is new niche that we can participate in: CM

KUCHING: Research and development (R&D) in security of online computer systems and databases is the next niche area for Sarawak, said Chief Minister Pehin Sri Abdul Taib Mahmud last night.

"Sarawak is committed to the advancement of security R&D and we think that this is a niche that we can participate in," he said here at a banquet held after the conclusion of the International Conference on the Theory and Application of Cryptology and Information Security (ASIACRYPT 2007).

His text of speech was read by Deputy Chief Minister Damik Patinggi Tan Sri Dr George Chan.

Hoping that ASIACRYPT 2007 would be the start of bigger things in this field, he said the State government became the major financial supporter behind the conference by allocating over US\$20,000 (RM75,000) to fund its organisation. Part of the funding was also used to assist local researchers and students to participate in the conference.

"I believe that Sarawak has an important role in Malaysia's security R&D advancement.

Besides being developers and implementers of security, Sarawak has to do the procurement of knowledge and initiators of homegrown cryptologic techniques of national and international significance," he said.

Cryptology is the science and art of encoding and decoding information and messages in order to secure them.

In Sarawak, the Information Security Research (ISCR) REX Lab at the Swinburne University was set up to spearhead research in cryptography and authentication protocols as well as to engage in collaborative research work.

Taib said information security had become a hotbed issue following the 9/11 attacks.

Audience spellbound by renowned speaker

Cryptographer Vaudenay among top experts at ASIACRYPT 2007

KUCHING: One of the world's renowned cryptographers Serge Vaudenay was among the renowned speakers at the International Conference on the Theory and Application of Cryptology and Information Security, ASIACRYPT 2007 in Kuching.

On Monday, which was also the first day of the conference, he chaired a session on Number Theory and Elliptic Curve, and later presented a paper on 'Privacy Models for Radio-frequency identification (RFID)'.

Vaudenay, a professor at Ecole Polytechnique Fédérale de Lausanne (EPFL), or Swiss Federal Institute of Technology, was one of the many experts in cryptology and information security invited to Kuching.

The 39-year-old Frenchman has



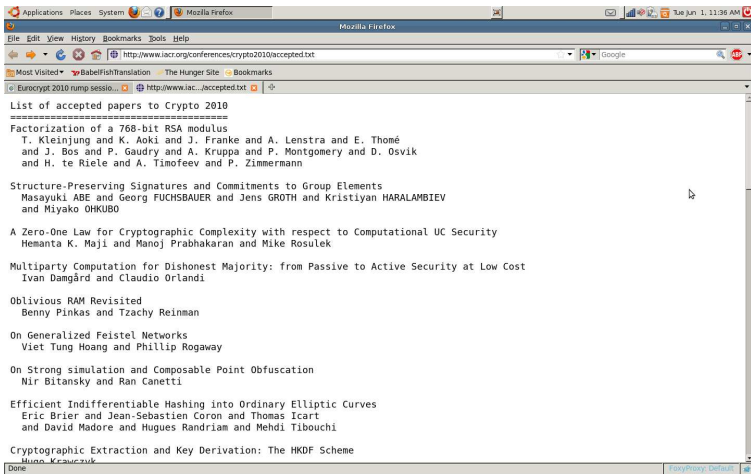
declassification theory, a system for designing block ciphers to be provably secure against many cryptanalytic attacks.

He has been at the lead of the Laboratory of Security and Cryptography (LASC) of EPFL, which is in the heart of Europe and is one of Europe's leading institutions of science and technology.

The four-day ASIACRYPT 2007 is being organised in Kuching by the Information Security Research (ISERES) Lab of Swinburne University of Technology (Swinburne Campus) and the Sarawak Development Institute (SDI), with support from the Sarawak government.

Cryptology is the practice and study of hiding information. In modern times, cryptology is considered to be a branch of both mathematics and computer science, and is affiliated closely with
